

# "What's your Month?" A HISTORY OF BIRTHSTONES

A talk & visual presentation by WALT LOMBARDO

in the Veterans Memorial Multi-Purpose Room 4117 Overland Ave, Culver City, CA 90230

The concept of birthstones goes back many centuries, its origins most likely tied to the biblical story of Aaron's Breastplate. Relating birthstones to one's birth month is similar to relating one's birth to astrological signs. Birthstones are certainly popular today, and are one strategy many use in buying a gift of jewelry for a friend or loved one. The gemstones used to represent each month have changed through time, in part related to the



abundance or favorability of a particular gemstone. This talk will discuss the history of birthstones and its evolution over time; and show how birthstone choices have changed and been advertised by the jewelry industry.

Walter Lombardo is a geologist with more than 35 years experience in mineralogy, mining and mineral exploration. He has worked as a mining and mineral exploration geologist for mining companies looking

for precious metals and industrial minerals. For sixteen years he managed the Southern Nevada Office of the Nevada Division of Minerals. And before retiring from the industry, was a project manager for a company involved in the worldwide exploration of uranium, gallium and germanium. Walter is the owner of Nevada Mineral & Book Company, a natural history gallery and earth science bookstore in Orange, California. He has lectured nationwide on topics related to mineral resources, mining & mining fraud, mineralogy and gemology. He has given a number of wonderful presentations to CCRMC.

Call the field trip leader beforehand for further information. Remember to sign in and out with the field trip leader


A Consent and Assumption of Risk Waiver of Liability form must be signed upon arrival at meeting site.

WHEN: Saturday January 21st at 8:00 AM

WHERE: Lavic Siding

MATERIAL: We will be collecting Agates and

Jaspers. *FEE:* \$0



MEET: Note correction: Hector Rd off I-40 on the south side for orientation and sign in. Waiver of liability will be signed at the meeting spot. From the meeting spot we will caravan for about 20 minutes to collecting site. Contact field trip leader for additional information.

*VEHICLES*: We will be traveling through a sandy wash so 4X4 is a must. Gas and food are available in Barstow.

WHAT TO BRING: Collecting bags/buckets, rock hammer, digging equipment, safety glasses and spray bottles, First Aid kit. Bring lunch, plenty of water and a camera; this widespread field offers no shade so use sun screen and protect yourself.

If you would like to stay for the weekend, this general area offers a wide variety of material so bring your rock collecting guides.

*NOTE*: This is the heart of the Mojave Desert and the weather can be unpredictable at this time of year so dress accordingly.

This trip may be canceled at the last minute due to bad weather, so please feel free to contact us the night before if weather is questionable.

Treat the desert with respect - tread lightly and pack it in / pack it out.

#### **JUST WORDS**

#### Stalactite vs. Stalagmite

A stalactite is an icicle-shaped formation that hangs from the ceiling of a cave, and is produced by precipitation of minerals from water dripping through the cave ceiling. Most stalactites have pointed tips.

A stalagmite is an upward-growing mound of mineral deposits that have precipitated from water dripping onto the floor of a cave. Most stalagmites have rounded or flattened tips.





#### **BENCH TIPS**

#### SANDING/POLISHING IN TIGHT PLACES

Often you'll need to sand or polish an area that's impossible to reach with even a small wheel on a flexshaft. Other times it might be the bottom of a



pocket or inside bottom corner of a box that needs to be finished. One trick

for these nit-picky jobs may be left over from your last Chinese dinner - a chopstick.

I've found quite a few uses for these in the shop. Prepare the tip by simply sawing it off at a 45 degree angle. Then apply whatever abrasive grit you will need for the job or hold a strip of sandpaper around the end. Loose grit can be held onto the tip with a bit of vaseline or oil. Tripoli or rouge can be just rubbed onto the end of the chopstick.

#### **OCHRE APPLICATOR**

Yellow ochre is used when you want to be sure the

solder won't flow on an area of your piece while you're soldering another area. The only problem with ochre is coming up with a good way to store and apply it.



I use recycled nail polish bottles. They seal well and have a built-in brush applicator. Just clean them out with a little acetone or nail polish remover, and they're ready to go

# What do you pay for when you use the club lapidary shop?

- Things that wear out, things that break. New or replacement tools.
- Utilities (lights, electricity, water) maintenance of the building and grounds.
- Consumables such as saw blades, cutting oil, sanding belts, lap disks, torch gas, paper towels, shop aprons.
- Maintenance such as sewer clogs, paint, light bulbs and tubes, repair parts for tools and equipment such as plumbing supplies, V-belts, hand tools, etc.

#### What do you get free?

Instructor's knowledge and help (instructors are volunteers, not paid), access to other club members' knowledge and help.

**Fees** are adjusted as needed each year, or more often if necessary. The shop committee evaluates cash flow and adjusts shop fees based on what actual costs occurred. Thus, you and all the others who use the shop ultimately set the shop fees. Use of the facilities and tools knowledgeably keeps costs down. Forcing, overloading, and other abuse of shop tools causes fees to rise. If you see others abusing or mishandling tools or equipment tell the instructor and/or offer instruction

The shop is a cooperative enterprise, share it, enjoy it, protect it.

Limited parking in back of the shop is open for use. Park on the asphalt, off the alley concrete to avoid a parking citation. Please respect the space reserved for the shop instructor next to the paddle-tennis court.

#### LIBRARY REPORT

To find out if a specific book or DVD is included in the library, use the database on the laptop computer that is located up against the filing cabinet. You can also do a search by subject.

Library items can be borrowed, free of charge, for up to 30 days. When borrowing anything from the library, a notation must be made in the ledger book located in the left cabinet over the front table, indicating the library item number, member name and date borrowed. When a return is made, a notation must be made on the "borrow line" indicating that the item has been returned. Items without a library number, such as magazines and DVDs still have to be logged in the ledger book.



Unfortunately, it appears that someone borrowed all our DVDs, forgot to make a notation in the ledger book and forgot to return them.
