# September Program Report: Dr. Arem's Gemstone Collection

Geologist Walt Lombardo discussed the private gems and minerals collection of Dr. Joel Arem. Dr. Arem received his PhD in Mineralogy from Harvard University and is the author of multiple books and articles on minerals and gems. He is a former curator of the Smithsonian Institution, co-founder of the Accredited Gemologists Association and Friends of Mineralogy and was the CEO of several gem companies.

Dr. Arem's collection has over five thousand specimens from around the world, selected over 50 years for their size, quality and rarity. The collection includes both common and rare items. Dr. Arem had an interest in collecting each mineral species, obtaining the color suites of each gemstone, as well as specimens from multiple mines and localities.

Fine jewelry-grade gemstones specimens in the collection include aquamarine, heliodor, morganite, chrysoberyl, garnets, sapphire, scapolite, spinel, topaz, tourmalines, among others.

Examples of rare gemstones in the collection include adamite, boracite, childrenite, dolomite, ekanite, hauyne, leucite, montebrasite, natrolite, pollucite, rhodochrosite, sapphirine, scolecite, triphyllite, vlasovite, willemite, yugawaralite, zektzterite.

Dr. Arem's Collection includes a wide variety of minerals and gemstones (both commercial and rare). These minerals and gems were acquired over a 50 year career in dealing in gemstones, where he was traveling and buying/selling on five continents. Many of these items were selected for their quality, size, and rarity. AGMG will initially be selling the rare gem portion of the collection, including many that were featured in the Color Encyclopedia of Gemstones.

**Historian** – keep a yearbook, collect and arrange clippings, information and pictures related to the Club, give a brief report at each meeting, and place a report in the *Nugget* dealing with Club history.

**Library** – display books and magazines at each meeting, record each item loaned-out, collect fines for overdue books, keep inventory, purchase new books and publications.

**Membership** – provide a register for guests and members at each meeting, appoint hosts to welcome guests, introduce guests to the membership, provide the President with necessary paperwork to present name badges to new members, ensure a quorum is present, provide a list of new and reinstated members, compile and publish an annual membership roster.

**Minerals** – in charge of displaying minerals at Club meetings and prepare articles on minerals for the *Nugget*.

**Nominating** – responsible for preparing a slate of officers for the November election meeting. The President is responsible to appoint a temporary chair.

**Photography** – responsible for taking pictures at Club field trips, social events, Fiesta of Gems, general meetings, and provides the historian with all photos to maintain a continuing record of Club activities.

**Program** – arrange for programs or discussions for each meeting.

**Publications** – publish and distribute (web master handles this) electronically to the membership a monthly bulletin, the *Nugget* and compile and publish an annual membership roster.

**Publicity** – responsible for publicity of each meeting, special events, and the Fiesta of Gems in the local paper and social media.

**Show** – the show committee arranges the Club's Fiesta of Gems show, and any other show that the Club may participate in.

**Shop** – the Shop committee selects instructors, provides a training program for those who want to be instructors, maintains Shop equipment, keeps a log of members and records money recieved, and responsible for ensuring Shop Rules are followed.

**Social** – in charge of all Club social activities (refreshments, parties, picnics, etc.) and responsible for show refreshments in collaboration with Show committee.

**Sunshine** – send cards or flowers to sick or bereaved members and to members who have welcomed a new baby.

**Trading Post** – conduct a "donation" drawing at each regular meeting.

**Web Master** – maintain the Club's website in a timely manner, ensure the website is representative of the Club and promotes the Club, oversee the Club's presence in social media, recommend cost and service effective web hosting companies, and cost effective domain name renewal.

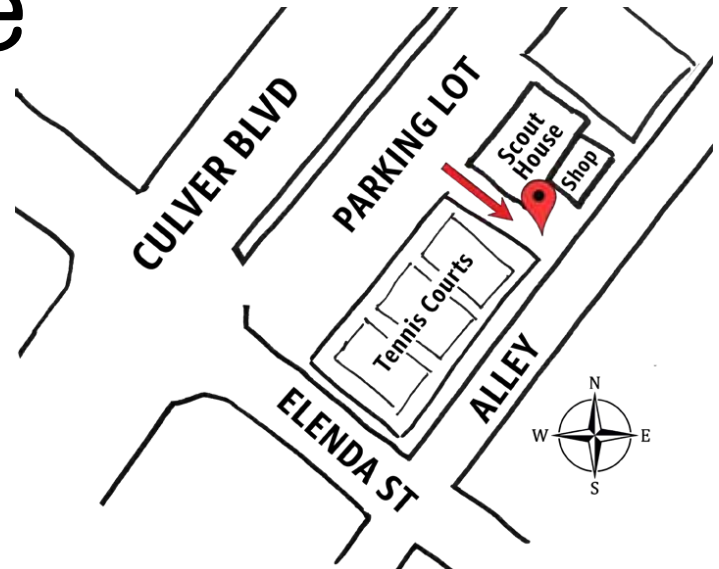

## What Mineral Am I?

I have glassy luster. My glassy yellow crystals are found in Mexico. My large, blue and green six-sided crystals are found in Canada, often found in orange Calcite. And my glassy purple six-sided crystals are found in Portugal. I am the most common phosphate mineral, which means I contain the element phosphorus. Phosphate is an important fertilizer for plants and crops. The teeth and bones of most animals are made of calcium phosphate, which is the same as my chemical formula. I am number 5 on the mineral hardness scale.
